Hebrews 7 v 25 – 8 v 6

Uriah Heap was very humble in his approach if he wanted something from the people he worked for. Our approach to the people we encounter, I hope, would be quite different both on the street and in church, guided by our respect for one another. The Jews however had very set ideas and believed only the high priests, could approach God and that would mean expensive sacrifices. They were set above the everyday person in the street and I imagine one would have to ingratiate one's self before them.

Jesus, our great High Priest however was and is approachable at any- time, any-where and by anyone who believes once and for all, 24/7, 365 a year, particularly busy on Sundays. Methodists, I don't think, are great at this priestly business, it's more about a one to one relationship we build up with Jesus, our friend and saviour, our mediator. We just know he will intercede should the need arise. We don't need to be ever-so humble but be prepared to take on the mind of Christ, looking not to our own interests but to the interests of others. (Phil2v5.)
